Recommendations:

Background:

Rock is required for multiple uses, including trail repairs, facility access roads, and excavation backfill. The City cannot use material excavated during day-to-day operations due to its low quality, saturation, and current City Code requirements.

Staff issued and awarded a bid (ITB #25061) to ESI Contracting Corp. for pricing agreements for 3/4" Clean and AB3 rock. This is year two of a three-year annual renewal option for these services.

The requested approval amount is based on the estimated total usage of this material over the course of a year in each division of the Municipal Services Department.

Emergency Justification:**Fiscal Impact:**

The fiscal impact to the City is \$480,700, including a ten percent (10%) contingency. Funding for these purchases is included in the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget on page 198, from the following accounts:

Recommendations:

Council approval is recommended.

Background:

The Rock Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant utilizes contracted transportation services for land application of all biosolids resulting from the wastewater treatment process. These biosolids are the result of wastewater being filtered to approximately 30% solid content and treated with lime to stabilize for safe handling and reuse. This is a necessary step in the treatment process, which supports high water quality standards and ensures environmental compliance. A third-party for biosolids transport is essential to provide reliable, compliant, and cost-effective removal of several tons of material generated daily.

The City issued an Invitation to Bid (ITB #25074) and awarded a pricing agreement to Synagro to provide these services on January 6, 2026. Year one pricing for this agreement will be in effect through January 6, 2027.

Emergency Justification:**Fiscal Impact:**

The fiscal impact to the City is \$220,000, including a ten percent (10%) contingency. Funding for biosolids hauling is included in the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 adopted budget, on page 198, in account number 0305220-5233.

Background:

Sodium hexametaphosphate is crucial in the water treatment process. It not only helps with corrosion control, but keeps filter performance at a level that sustains safe drinking water treated at the Courtney Bend Water Treatment Plant.

Shannon Chemical Corporation supplies the City with sodium hexametaphosphate, utilizing a cooperative contract (No. 111) through the Mid-America Regional Council/Kansas City Regional Cooperative.

Section 8.06.004, Paragraph 4 of the City Code states that competitive bidding is not required when purchases are made through a cooperative contract established by a government purchasing entity or cooperative. The cooperative bids used have been established pursuant to RSMo.70.220 or generally accepted governmental purchasing practices through the competitive bidding process.

Approval of this item shall authorize change orders up to a total of ten percent (10%) of the authorized amount for each order, provided appropriations are available.

The fiscal impact to the City is \$165,000, including a ten percent (10%) contingency. Funding for sodium hexametaphosphate is included in the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget, on page 198, in account number 0404830-5314.

Council approval is recommended.

Background:

Liquid chlorine is combined with anhydrous ammonia and is used to prevent contamination of the water supply treated at the Courtney Bend Water Treatment Plant. Sodium hypochlorite is used to disinfect effluent water at the Rock Creek Wastewater Treatment plant.

The supplier of these chemicals is PVS DX, Inc, which has cooperative contract 111 through the Mid-America Regional Council/Kansas City Regional Cooperative.

Section 8.06.004, Paragraph 4 of the City Code states that competitive bidding is not required when purchases are made through a cooperative contract established by a government purchasing entity or cooperative. The cooperative bids used have been established pursuant to RSMo. 70.220 or generally accepted governmental purchasing practices through the competitive bidding process.

Emergency Justification:**Fiscal Impact:**

The fiscal impact to the City is \$451,000, including a ten percent (10%) contingency. Funding for water disinfection chemicals is included in the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget, on page 198, in account numbers 0404830-5314 (Courtney Bend Water Treatment Plant) and 0305220-5309 (Rock Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant).
